



Tropical Weather Alert:

At 2pm, recently upgraded Tropical Storm Igor remains located over the far eastern Atlantic, well over 3,330 miles from Indian River County with maximum winds of 40 mph. As Igor continues moving west over the next 3 days, environmental conditions are favorable for strengthening and Igor could become a hurricane by Sunday. On the current forecast track, Igor will remain well east of the Leeward Islands through early next week.

The National Hurricane Center continues monitoring a tropical wave over the Windward Islands which continues to show signs of organization. There is a 50% chance that this wave could become a tropical depression or storm within the next 2 days as it moves west-northwest into the Caribbean Sea. The next name on the 2010 list is Julia.

There is currently no threat to Indian River County. We will continue to monitor the tropics and advise you as conditions warrant.

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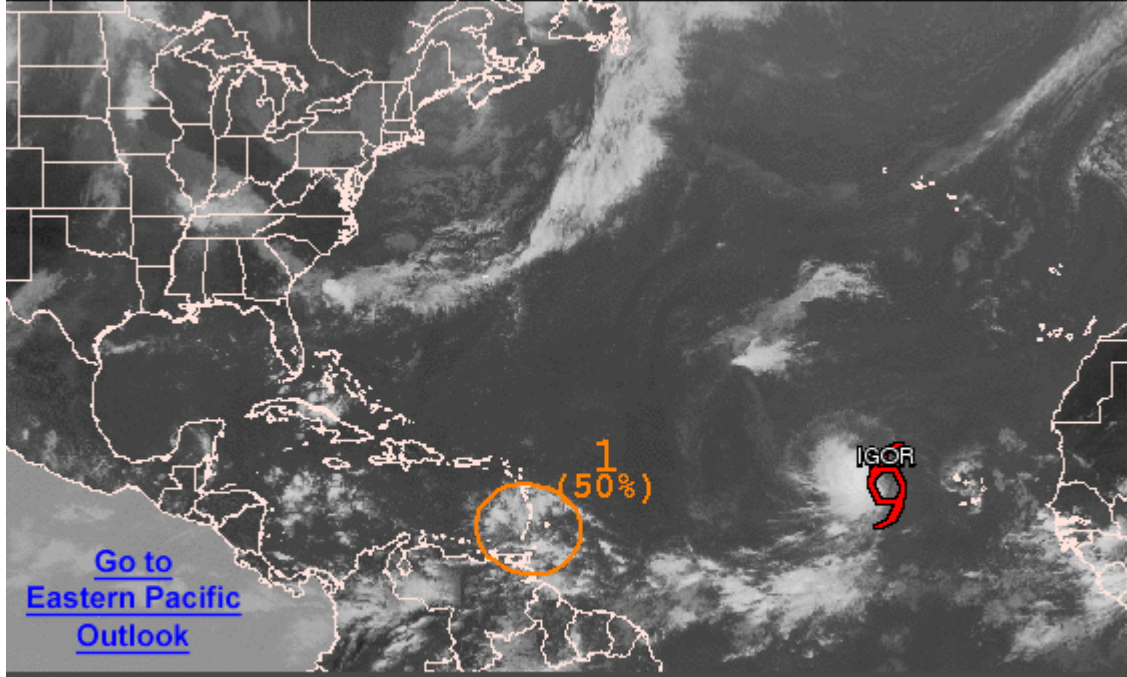
